HISTORY

Designated in 1990, the Town Hall Square Historic District recalls Palm Beach's early, pedestrian-oriented days. The area has served as the commercial and governmental center of Palm Beach since Town Hall was built in 1926. The stores and offices which extend from Royal Palm Way to Worth Avenue along South County Road serve the daily need of residents today, much the way they did sixty years ago. The Memorial Fountain, which extends north from the building, creates a dramatic focal point when approaching from Royal Palm Way. The architectural styles of the many shops and offices in this district are varied, but the buildings are united by their intimate scale, and by virtue of being first rate examples of their respective styles.
